# Keep in mind, 'Be natural Board Member and trust your instincts' in everything!

Senior Executive Director of International Relations at the Osaka Prefecture, Board Member for the Osaka Foundation of International Exchange

## Hirofumi Ichisaka

My name is Ichisaka, I am the Senior Executive Director of International Relations at the Osaka Prefecture, and a board member for the Osaka Foundation of International Exchange. Daily, I am a point of contact for urban diplomacy with the Consulate-Generals in Osaka and Kansai, the embassies of various countries in Tokyo, and other foreign government agencies. I act as a liaison, coordinating Osaka Prefecture's international relations measures, such as courtesy visits by foreign dignitaries with the governor and exchange projects with friendly exchange partner local governments.

Previous Directors of International Relations have had a wide range of backgrounds, including directors who had experience living overseas, transferred from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, or came from private companies. I have no experience studying or living abroad, but a quick look back on my work history shows a wealth of international related matters that I have been involved with for the prefecture. These matters include things such as economic and business relations, attracting international conferences, port promotion, inbound tourism and exchange programs with Osaka's sister cities. Furthermore, up until last year, I was working on inviting international participants for the 2025 Japan World Exposition Association. Through these varied work experiences, I have built many relationships with people from all over the world.

Every time I have been involved in international work, I have felt the

importance of language and also having an understanding of each different country's histories and cultures. Also, I think it has been even more important for me to always

do my best to trust my instincts. For example, I had the following experience. When I was in charge of a tourist information center, I proposed the establishment of a new Chinese language service, but according to a performance report, it was not necessary because most of the visitors used English. Without trusting my instincts, I might have thought that was a good enough explanation, however I wasn't convinced, so I visited the site and asked the director of the center about it. He said that only English speakers came because they only had signs in English. He continued, if we put up Chinese signs, we would be swamped with Chinese speakers. Even things that we are familiar with can be mixed with invisible biases. Especially between different cultures, if you don't make an effort to consciously observe, you may not notice the barriers that lurk beneath. I hope that OFIX and everyone involved in promoting multicultural coexistence in Osaka Prefecture will be able to use even a part of my experience as an example to learn from. Let's pool our wisdom and work together. Now, don't be nervous, take the weight off your shoulders, be natural and trust your instincts!

Caleb's recommended:

Fried Okra S

Fresh okra is sliced and coated in seasoned cornmeal, then fried until golden and crispy in this simple recipe!

#### **Ingredients:**

- Okra
- Egg
- · cornmeal/flour
- · Oil (to fry with)
- Seasonings for flavor (Salt, Black Pepper, Cayene Pepper/ Red Chili for spice)

#### Recipe:

- 1. Cut the okra into bite-sized pieces and soak them in a beaten egg.
- 2. Meanwhile, combine the cornmeal/flour and seasonings in a small bowl.
- 3. Coat the egg-soaked okra in the cornmeal/flour mix, coating completely.



Make sure to fully **POINT** coat the okra before frying it!

- 4. Heat the oil over medium-high heat. Place the coated okra in the oil and fry the okra while stirring continuously. Reduce the heat when it starts to brown.
- 5. Cook until golden and drain on paper towels.
- 6. Serve on a plate.


